Dr. Mahesh Chandra Mishra joined AIIMS on July 16, 1980 and is presently garnishing the offices of Director, AIIMS and Chief, JPN Apex Trauma Centre of AIIMS. He has successfully completed 32 years of service at AIIMS and has earned name and fame in establishing JPN Apex Trauma Centre at AIIMS. He has the honour of having been awarded the following distinctions and activities in various fields:-

He participated in World Trauma Congress held on 22-25 August 2012 in RIO DE JANEIRO, BRAZIL as international guest faculty and Chaired Scientific Session. He happened to be the President of International College of Laparoscopic Surgeons, 2012, delivered "Silver Jubilee MASICON Oration" at Association of Surgeons of India, Nagpur. Delivered Dr. G. Subba Rao Oration on "Abdominal Trauma" on 11 March 2012 at Gandhi Medical College, Secunderabad, Presidential Oration during 4th Annual National Conference of the Society of Endoscopic and Laparoscopic Surgeons of India, in 2011, Dr. Pritam Das Oration during National CME and Live Operative Workshop at Allahabad and delivered Grand Round on Breast cancer at the Iowa, USA as Visiting Professor.

Dr. Mahesh Chandra Mishra was elected President of Indian Society of Trauma and Acute care, 2012 and President of Society of Endoscopic and Laparoscopic Surgeons of India in 2011. He happened to be the Founder President of Indian Society of Trauma and Acute Care and Indian Hernia Society, Honorary Fellow of Royal College of Physicians & Surgeons, Glasgow (FRCS) on 14th March, 2012 and National Academy of Medical Sciences and American College of Surgeons.

He enjoyed the membership of many Professional Bodies and was awarded Public Recognition by Shri Chunni Lal Jindal Memorial Trust for "Public Service", SUKRITI GAURAV AWARD by the Institute for Environment, YOGA and Social Service at India International Centre, New Delhi, "Scroll of Honour" on the occasion of 94th DMA Foundation Day on 10th August, 2008, Dr. B.C. Roy National Award of Medical Council of India in 1996 from the President of India and Commonwealth Medical Fellowship at University of Manchester, U.K. in 1998.

Apart from the above prominent distinctions and achievements, Dr. Mahesh Chandra Mishra has also published more than 100 original articles in Indexed International Journals.

To sum up Dr. Mishra's contribution in the Medical field has been commendable and enormous to be remembered for a long time to come.

Profile of GUEST OF HONOUR



Sh. R. S. Sodhi
Former Judge, Delhi High Court

Justice R.S. Sodhi was born on 11th November, 1945. He passed out from Bishop Cotton School, Shimla in 1962, and graduated from Lyallpur Khalsa College, Jalandhar in 1969. He did his LL.B. from Panjab University, Chandigarh in 1972, and was enrolled as an Advocate with Bar Council of Delhi in the same year. He did his legal practice in the Supreme Court of India for 25 years. He was Advocate-on-Record in the Supreme Court of India for the State of Punjab from 1987-1989, Additional Advocate General for the State of Punjab from 1997 to July, 1999. Justice Sodhi had specialization in the constitutional law, civil law, criminal law, land revenue laws and laws relating to excise matters.

Considering his achievements as a senior advocate in the highest court of the country, the Govt. of India appointed him as Judge of Delhi High Court on 7th July, 1999. He superannuated from the service on 7th Nov. 2007. Justice Sodhi has created a niche for himself in the stratum of legal luminaries through his landmark judgments, particularly the judgment pronounced by him in the Jessica Lal case.

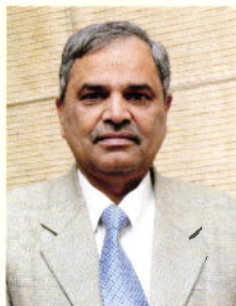



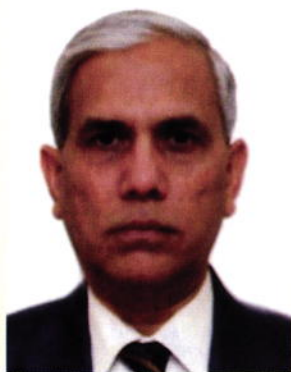

He has published more than 200 papers in national and international journals.

Vice-Chancellor's Report

It is my proud privilege to welcome Prof. M.C. Mishra, Director, AIIMS, New Delhi, the Chief Guest, Sh. R.S. Sodhi, former hon'ble Chief Justice, Guest of Honor, Honorable Chancellor, members of various University statutory bodies - the Governing Body, Board of Management, Academic Council, University Advisory Body, recipients of degrees, media persons, ladies and gentlemen and Managing Trustee, Shri Man Mohan Singh Chawla ji. In the year 2002, the Managing Trustee of Dashmesh Educational Charitable Trust established the Dental College, followed by College of Nursing, College of Physiotherapy, Medical College and SGT Institute of Engineering and Technology which was established in 2010. On 24th January 2013, this Group of Institutions was declared by an Act of Assembly of Haryana as a State Private University under the State Private Universities (Amendment) Act No. 8 of 2013 of Haryana. Subsequently, the University was granted permission on 17th April 2013 to take over all the existing colleges within its ambit. It was followed by a request by the University to seek permission to start various new courses — Bachelor and Master degree courses in various subjects and some professional courses. Permission for the same was granted by the Govt. of Haryana on 16th December 2013. It was followed by the State Govt. permission to offer research programmes in a variety of areas which culminated in the enrollment of 15 Ph.D. scholars in departments wherever eligible guides and facilities are available as per guidelines of statutory bodies such as Medical Council of India, Dental Council of India, and University Grants Commission. The University has admitted 542 students during 2013-14 in various courses, raising the total strength of students, both undergraduate and postgraduate, to 1500. There is no dearth of well-qualified and experienced teaching faculty, good hostel facilities and recreational facilities in the campus. It has always been our endeavour to improve the infrastructure holistically so as to transform the University into a Centre of Excellence for others to emulate.

Thus far, the medical, dental and other courses, which have now been taken over by this University, were affiliated to the Pt. B.D. Sharma University of

Health Sciences, Rohtak, and, today on the occasion of its first anniversary, we have assembled here to award degrees conferred by Pt. B.D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak.

Our Faculty of Medicine & Health Sciences is enviably guided by Dr. (Mrs.) Kamlesh Kohli, former Inspector of Medical Council of India and Prof. and Head, Lady Harding Medical College New Delhi. Its departments of Anatomy and Physiology are richly equipped with the museums and other teaching facilities to train the undergraduate and postgraduate students. Several of the faculty members of these departments have participated in national conferences and workshops. The faculty of the Department of Pharmacology, apart from engaging in teaching and training, have published research papers and have made presentations of their research findings in the national and international conferences. The Department is also maintaining an animal house. The Department of Forensic Medicine & Toxicology has shown 100% results, thus proving their teaching and training capabilities. The Department of Home, Haryana has given permission for postmortem which is going to be in place very shortly. The Department has also developed a "Toxicology Garden" with common 'poisonous plants' on display in abundance for the awareness of the visitors. The Department of Community Medicine, apart from celebrating World Health Day 2013 and World AIDS Day 2013, has published research papers and is engaged in reaching the rural community in distant areas. The Department of General Surgery is providing excellent surgical care and is popular for its services in the surrounding areas. We provide services at highly affordable expenses. For instance, Laparoscopy Surgery is performed for paltry charge of Rs 1500/- only. The Department of General Medicine is providing round the clock medical services to the sick and critically ill patients in emergency department and its Intensive Care Unit with high level of patient satisfaction. The Department of ENT has operated more than 1,000 patients successfully and has organized numerous awareness camps for impaired hearing, head and neck cancer screening and for school health check up. They have developed vertigo clinic, video endoscopy and temporal bone dissection


laboratory for teaching purposes. The Department of Pediatrics, in collaboration with the Department of Community Medicine, is conducting research project entitled "Feeding Pattern of Children Aged 6-23 Months: Knowledge, Perception and Practices of Mothers in Rural Community of Haryana". The Department of Orthopedics, headed by former Director General, Armed Forces Medical Services, is providing excellent clinical services. The Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology is providing antenatal, obstetrics and gynecological services to the community. Dr. Balbir Chhabra, Prof. & Head of the Department of the Anesthesiology has been awarded 'The Life Time Achievement Award' under the aegis of Indian Society of Anaesthesiologists by the Chief Minister of Haryana. The Department of Radiology is in process of installation of CT scan and MRI, in addition to other routine Radiological and Ultrasound instruments. The Department of Pulmonary Medicine is actively engaged in running DOTS programme for detection of Pulmonary Tuberculosis and is providing free treatment to all cases of Pulmonary Tuberculosis coming to the University Hospital. The Department is also running an ICU for cases of respiratory failure.

The Faculty of Dental Sciences came into existence as the SGT Dental College, Hospital and Research Institute in 2002. It is the University's flagship organ, having highly experienced and dedicated faculty. The teachers of this Faculty are actively engaged in patient care and research activities, and is very popular for its clinical services in this region. This faculty has published over 300 research papers which are well indexed in scientific publications. A large number of our faculty and postgraduate students have actively participated in national and international conferences, and some of them shoulder the responsibilities as office bearers in the professional associations. Dr. Rohan Diwakar of this Faculty got the "Best Paper Prize" and Dr. Ritu Phogat was selected as second best and Dr. Ankita Jhalani's poster was selected as the best poster in the National PG Convention in Orthodontics which was held in Vishakapatnam on 16-18th March 2013. Dr. Suman Yadav has a patent on "innovative novel irrigate made by various herbal extracts", for clinical practice in Endodontic. The Periodontology Department played a pivotal role in "National Workshop in Curriculum Reform" under revised BDS course regulation 2007, organized by DCI this year. The Department also participated in "Total Evaluation and Management (TEAM)" event. The Oral Surgery Department is engaged in

offering full spectrum of surgical services including cleft lip, cleft palate, oral cancer surgery, reconstructive surgery, Orthognathic and Trauma Procedures. The Department is having a liaison with the Regional Cancer Centre, Trivandrum for exposure of our PG students. The Department of Pedodontics is committed to the dental treatment of children and developing preventive strategies. This Department has a special "School Dental Health Programme" successfully running in Jhajjar and Gurgaon districts. The Department organized a programme on "Current Perspectives in Pediatric Dentistry – An Update" and has also won a prize in quiz contest held by Subartha University. The Department of Oral Pathology organized a national level CDE programme in collaboration with the Oral Medicine and Oral Surgery Department in May 2013 along with 2-day Pre-Conference Workshop on Implants and DNA Fingerprinting. They also organized hands on training on DNA Fingerprinting in the University campus in collaboration with DNA Laboratory of AIIMS. Public Health Dentistry Department has developed an annual programme for conducting outreach oral health camps in rural areas catering to 150 villages located within 100 Kms of this University in 2013. Over 60,000 patients were screened in rural areas. In addition, the nearby schools were covered by way of weekly visits to screen, educate and provide compressive oral health care through the school health programme. The Department has also approached Central Jail (Tihar) and Central Jail at Bhondsi, Haryana for the dental check-ups of the inmates. Department also won "Best Paper Award" in 16th National Conference of Indian Association of Public Health Dentistry at Bangalore. The Faculty of Commerce and Management, which was started recently, organized a seminar on 26th September 2013 which was attended by prominent personalities. The faculty also organized a workshop on personality development of the students.

The Faculty of Nursing was established in 2012 to offer B. Sc. in Nursing, B.Sc. in Post Basic Nursing, General Nursing and Midwifery and Auxiliary Nursing and Midwives courses.

The Faculty of Allied Health Sciences was started with 8 B.Sc. and Diploma courses, namely in Operation Theatre Technology, Medical Laboratory Technology, Radio-Imaging Technology and Optometry. These courses are job-oriented and will produce trained manpower to meet the demand of the technical manpower in the health



care industry in Gurgaon region which is fast coming up as a Health Care Hub. I am happy to inform that the students have joined these courses from all over India and neighboring countries.

The Faculty of Physiotherapy, took the first stride with the introduction of Bachelor of Physiotherapy course in 2008. The postgraduate courses in different streams were embarked on in 2011. Ultra modern equipments and latest course curricula are used for the training of the students. The Faculty has earned accolades by producing competent professionals, and almost all of them have found employment either in the corporate sector or the educational institutions. Some of them have secured top ranks in the University examinations. The faculty runs an OPD where the number of patients is swelling fast. This apart, the faculty is engaged in research programmes. More than half a dozen publications, published in international and national journals, stand to their credit. Organization of workshops, seminars and conferences is the regular activity of this Faculty.

I can assure that this University will not leave any stone unturned in providing quality education to its students. Rendition of selfless service to the society, the state and the nation at large is our motto.

Before leaving the podium, I would like to wish all the degree holders a prosperous and eventful career and hope them to serve the society with dedication. Your selfless service will earn encomium for you, your parents and the institution which shaped you into a conscientious and compassionate professional.

Having all major and sub-specialties, it

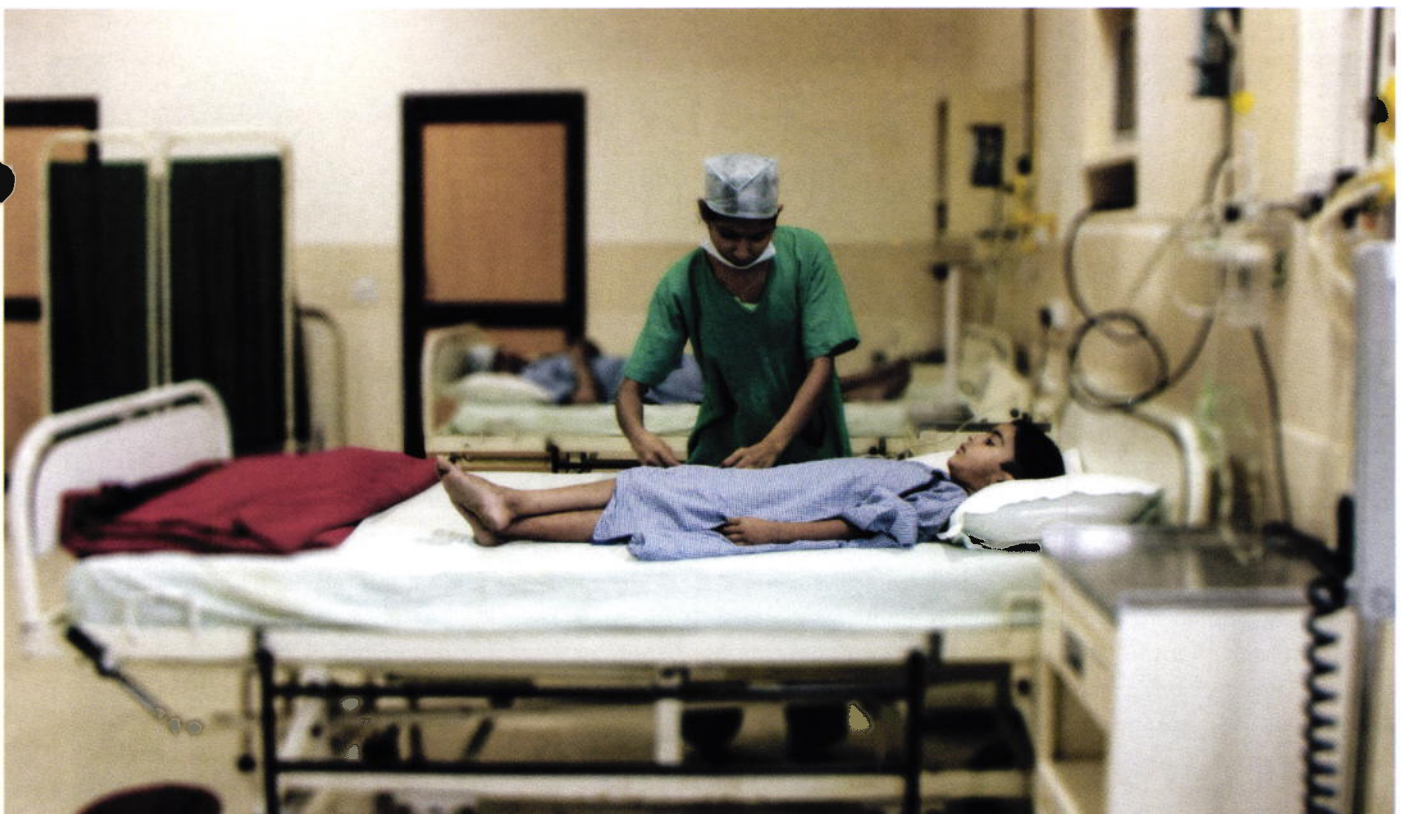

The Medical College has adopted 100 villages in its vicinity where general and specialized health check-up camps are arranged from time to time with the help of non-government organizations to provide free services to the poor and needy patients. Free transport services are available for the patients requiring specialized hospital services. Rural and Urban Health Training Centers, besides training the undergraduate students, provide medical services to the patients living in the surrounding areas.



Academic Activities



The College organizes continuing medical education (CME) programs on various subjects for faculty and students to impart knowledge on recent advances in medical field.

Training programs have been organised on "Basic Life Support", "Antimicrobial Resistance", "No Actions Today No Cure Tomorrow", "Role of FNAC in Diagnosis of Pediatrics

Numbers of cultural programmes, melodius songs, thrilling dances, rib tickling plays, etc. were presented by the students which left audience spell bound.

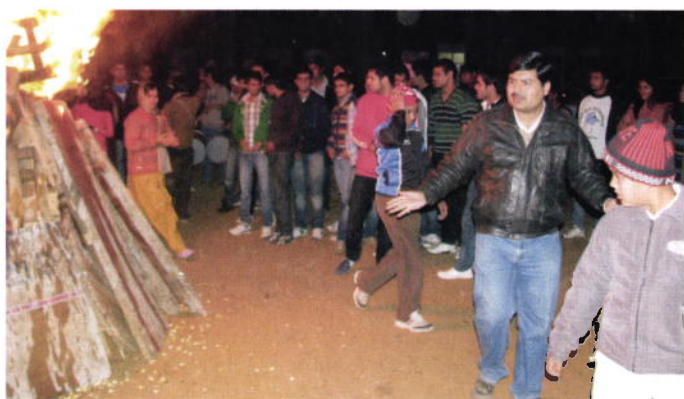

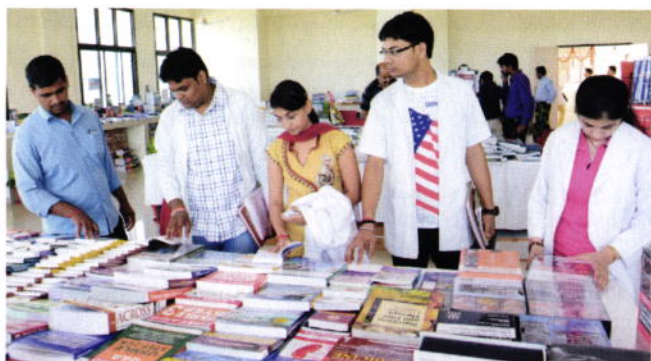


Holika Dahan was celebrated on 7th March 2013, followed by Dhulendi – a day dedicated to colors, on next day.

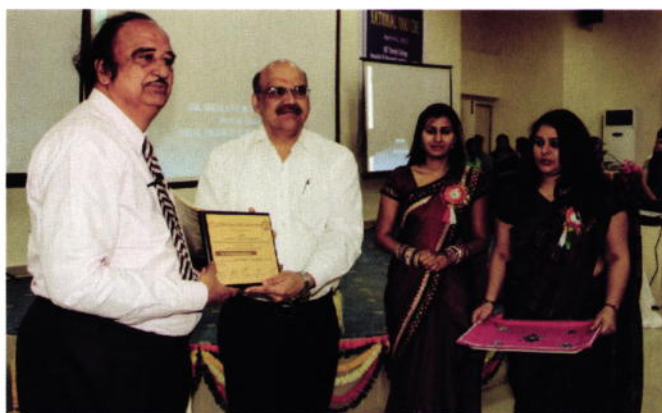

AIIMS-UDM-SGT National Symposium on “Multi speciality Dentistry- The Way Forward”

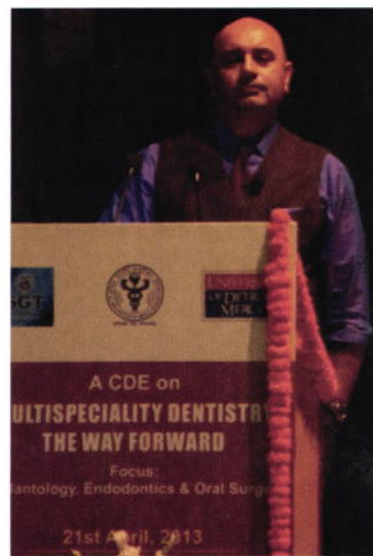
