Dr. T.D. Dogra joined All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) as a Resident Doctor way back in 1971 and held many responsible positions - Head of Department of Forensic Medicine and Toxicology, Dean (Exams.), Deputy Director (Administration), Chairman, Hospital Management Board, Superintendent of Hostels, In-charge CMET, In-charge, Faculty Affairs and Appellant Authority of RTI, before his elevation to the post of Director of the Institute in 2007-2009.

After his superannuation from AIIMS on 2nd July 2012, he joined SGT Group of Institutions having Dental College, Medical College, SGT Institute of Engg. & Technology, Dasmesh College of Physiotherapy, Dasmesh College of Nursing, and Instt. of Para Medical Sciences as Director General.

Dr. Dogra is an academician of international repute in Forensic Medicine & Toxicology. He edited one of the oldest textbooks on medical jurisprudence "Lyon's Medical Jurisprudence for India" and prepared the manual for medico-legal work. He is co-author of The book : "Practical Aspects of Forensic Medicine and Toxicology". He has to his credit more than 200 papers published in national and international journals and has been an expert member of numerous committees including Selection Committees constituted by the Govt. of India, State Governments, AIIMS and other organizations. He is a founder of "Journal of Forensic Medicine and Toxicology" and "Indian Internet Journal of Forensic Medicine and Toxicology".

He has given medico-legal opinion to three Prime Ministers of India, namely, Indira Gandhi, Charan Singh and Rajiv Gandhi. He was deputed by the Government of India to Sri Lanka as a member of three member team in regard to investigation of assassination of Sri Dishanayake, a presidential candidate.

Vice-Chancellor's Report

On the eve of the second convocation, it is a moment of honour for me to welcome **Hon'ble Minister of Road Transport and Highways** Sh. Nitin Jairam Gadkari, the Chief Guest on this auspicious ceremony. I also welcome Hon'ble Chancellor, Sh. Ram Bahadur Rai ji, Managing Trustee, Shri Man Mohan Singh Chawla ji, esteemed members of the various statutory bodies of the University, recipients of degrees, esteemed parents/guardians of the Graduates, friends from media, Ladies and Gentlemen.

Sir, inspired by the teachings of the Shree Guru Gobind Singh Ji, the tenth Sikh Guru that "the spread of knowledge (Gyan) is the highest service to mankind", The Dashmesh Educational Charitable Trust, under the able guidance of its philanthropist Trustee - Shri Man Mohan Singh Chawla ji, established the Dental College in 2002. The process to serve the society by way of providing "Dental Health Care" and spreading knowledge through this college, set the stage for future. Today we witness that this initiative has widened the scope of "service to mankind" in terms of the establishment of SGT Medical College, Dashmesh College of Nursing, SGT College of Physiotherapy, Institute of Paramedical Sciences, and SGT Institute of Engineering and Technology and ultimately the establishment of the SGT University by convergence of the aforesaid institutes by the Haryana Act No. 8 of 2013.

The University was further permitted by the state govt. vide its order dated 16th December 2013 to start various new courses, including professional courses leading to various levels

of degrees in various disciplines. The commitment of the University towards fulfilment of its objectives—service, leadership development, innovation encouragement, insemination of strong ethical values, and the facilities and infrastructure made available to the satisfaction of various regulatory bodies—prompted the State Govt. further to permit the University to offer Research Programmes in various disciplines. It enabled the creation of a team of approx. 50 young and dynamic research scholars for Ph.D. in various disciplines.

Sir, with the dedication and the foresightedness of the Trustees, the seed sown in 2002 in the form of a dental college has now developed into a young fruit bearing tree within a short span of 11 years and will grow to its full-bloom glory sooner than later to serve the society with its sweet fruits.

The University, spread over an area of 60 Acres of land at Budhera village of Gurgaon district, is presently offering more than 80 courses leading to award of Diploma, Undergraduate, Postgraduate and Ph.D. degrees in various disciplines. The University had ten faculties, namely, Faculty of Medicine & Health Sciences, Faculty of Dental Sciences, Faculty of Nursing, Faculty of Allied Health Sciences, Faculty of Physiotherapy, Faculty of Commerce & Management, Faculty of Law, Faculty of Physical Sciences, Faculty of Mass Communication & Media Technology, and Faculty of Hotel & Tourism Management. The Faculty of Behavioural Health Sciences has been carved out of the Faculty of Medicine &

Health Sciences, raising the number of faculties to eleven. One more department, viz., Dept. of Pharmacy is going to be added to the Faculty of Medicine & Health Sciences, and one additional Faculty—Faculty of Indian Medical System (Ayurveda) is proposed to be set up from the academic session 2015-16. During 2014-15, more than 900 students were enrolled in various courses against enrollment of 550 in 2013-14, raising total strength from 1500 in 2013-14 to over 2400 in 2014-15 session.

Sir, the experienced and talented team of faculty is the backbone of an academic institution. The University, apart from strengthening the infrastructure in terms of buildings, labs etc., has focused on strengthening its faculty. Appx. 50 Faculty members were inducted into the team during last one year. Similarly, on the administration side also, dedicated and experienced officers team has been inducted. Full-fledged Examination Branch has been made functional and in near future the ERP system of the university will be functional and thus there will be a paperless “e-governance” system on the campus. University is taking care that the development of infrastructure is eco-friendly, as environment protection has been our priority. As a result of encouragement by the University, a good number of faculty members attended national/international conferences and seminars. The University encourages the students also to participate in the Workshops & Conferences. I congratulate our faculty for producing over 150 research papers, published in national and international journals during the preceding year.

Sir, in order to keep pace with our National Education Policy and guidelines issued by the Central Govt. through Ministry of HRD and UGC from time to time, the University has already switched over to semester system. The Choice Based Credit System has already

been adopted in the Law courses, while its implementation in the Faculty of Commerce & Management, Faculty of Physical Sciences, Faculty of Mass Communication & Media Technology, Faculty of Hotel & Tourism Management and the Faculty of Behavioural Health Sciences is in the offing. The advice of the respective regulatory bodies such as Medical Council of India, Dental Council of India and Indian Nursing Council has been sought for switch over from the percent system to the grading system. We'll implement the Choice Based Credit System in the professional courses as soon as we receive go-ahead from the Councils. As a matter of fact, it has always been our endeavor to improve the infrastructure holistically and introduce innovations so as to transform the University into a Centre of Excellence.

Sir, prior to establishment of this university, the erstwhile Medical and Dental Colleges, being run by the Trust, were affiliated to the Pt. B.D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak. Now these and other colleges form integral part of this University. Today we have assembled here to award degrees conferred by Pt. B.D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak upon the students who have passed their degree courses successfully from that university.

The Faculty of Medicine & Health Sciences, apart from MBBS course, is running M.Sc. (Medical) and M.D. courses in 8 pre and para clinical and Ph.D. in 4 subjects. The Faculty has state-of-the-art lecture theatres, labs equipped with latest equipments and instruments, museums, well maintained animal house, a “Toxicology Garden” and other facilities for teaching and research. The 580-bed Hospital serves as a platform for on-the-job training of the students as well as health care centre for patients of the surrounding areas. The Department of Home Affairs, Haryana has permitted the University for post-mortem. Start of Internship of first

batch of the Faculty is a golden feather in its cap. The Faculty Members have more than 72 research papers to their credit. The Faculty is going to apply to the MCI for starting M.D. courses in clinical subjects from the academic session 2016-17.

The University has entered into MOU with the prestigious hospitals, namely, 'Fortis Hospital' and 'Artemis Health Sciences', Gurgaon to collaborate with the university for class-room teaching and course curriculum designing for the Bachelor degree courses in "Sleep Disorder Technology" and "Neuro-Physiology Technology". The Faculty observed "World Health Day" by organizing a seminar on the topic "Small Bite, Big Threat: Prevention of vector-borne Disease" – a true step to draw attention of all concerned towards a major health problem. It has also organized an "Orientation Programme" on August 13, 2014 to give an opportunity to the freshers. In order to provide the faculty members an exposure to teaching skills for effective delivery of knowledge and information to the students, the Faculty organized a "Workshop on Medical Education Technologies" from 22 – 25 Sept., 2014, a programme sponsored by the MCI.

Sir, **The Faculty of Dental Sciences**, which was initially established as "SGT Dental College, Hospital and Research Institute" in 2002, is a well known name not only in Haryana and NCR, but in the country also. Apart from the dental health care and research activities, it is very popular for its clinical services in this region. This faculty has published over 73 research papers during the preceding year. In addition to Bachelor degree, the Faculty of Dental Sciences is running the Postgraduate course (M.D.S.) in 9 superspecialities and Ph.D. in 2 subjects. In order to provide global exposure to the students and Faculty members, it has an MOU with the University of Detroit-Mercy, Michigan, USA for an annual Exchange

Programme. It continued its pace with the tradition set by it for organizing the workshops, seminar and conferences. It has organized Workshop on "Insight Into Questionnaire Designing, Validation And Problem Solving" on 10th March 2014 attracting more than 175 registrations from all over the country. It has gone a step further to host from 17th to 29th March, 2014 the event namely "FACE 2014" conference, an event organized for the first time in Northern India. It further organized a multi-specialty Dental Education Programme on May 4, 2014, on the subject "Recent Advances in Clinical Dentistry". The faculty members really deserve a cheer up for it, Congratulations my dear friends.

The Faculty, in collaboration with industry and NGOs arranged around 20 free camps for Dental Health care where "dental health kits/material" was distributed free of cost. The "SGT – Colgate Future Dentist Professional Programme" remained a well acknowledged "Academic activity & Industry linkage" event, which is the need of the hour.

The **Faculty of Law** is running BALLB (Hons.) 5-year integrated and LLM courses. The University has applied to the Bar Council of India for permission to start B.A. LL.B. 3-year programme from 2015-16 academic year. The faculty is well known nationally and internationally for its clinical legal education system. It organized a National Essay competition on "Expectations of Law Students From A Great Law School" in July, 2014. On 29th Nov., 2014, the Faculty organized a national seminar on "Medical Negligence : Issues and Responses". The Faculty of Law of this University is one of the 10 Indian Law Schools/institutes to become the member of the elite International Association of Law Schools.

The law students and the faculty members had a golden opportunity to interact with the

legal luminary in the person of Hon'ble Mr. Justice Rohinton F. Nariman during his felicitation programme organized by the University on July 26, 2014. Of late, the Faculty organized the "First National Moot Court Competition" from March 13 to 15, 2015. Twenty teams from various law institutes from across the country participated in the event. Hon'ble Mr. Justice Ranjan Gogoi, Judge of the Supreme Court was very kind to give a word of wisdom to the participants through his inaugural speech.

The **Faculty of Physiotherapy** is running one Undergraduate, four Postgraduate and Ph.D. programmes. The students are benefitted by the hands on training in our own hospital. The Faculty of Nursing offers three courses, namely, Diploma in General Nursing and Midwifery, Post Basic B. Sc. (Nursing) and B Sc. (Nursing). Master courses in Nursing are proposed to be offered from the ensuing academic session subject to clearance from the regulatory body.

The **Faculty of Allied Health Sciences** offers five UG and three Diploma courses. Five Master degree courses in MLT, OTT, RIT, OPT and Nutrition & Dietetics are proposed to be offered from the next academic session.

The **Faculty of Commerce and Management** runs three undergraduate programmes, viz. B.Com., BBA (General) & BBA (Hospital Administration) and Ph.D. in Management. B.Com. (Hons.), M.Com. and PG Diploma in Retail Management will be launched from 2015-16 session. The **Faculty of Physical Sciences** is running B.Sc. (Non Medical) Course since last academic year. M.Sc. (Chemistry), M.Sc. (Physics) and M.Sc. (Maths) are going to be launched from the 2015-16 session. The **Faculty of Hotel & Tourism Management** is running the Bachelor of Hotel Management course to cater the requirements of the tourism and hotel industry. The Faculty of Mass Communication

& Media Technology is running B.A. (Journalism & Mass Communication) course since last year. M.A. (Mass Communication), B.A. (Film Making) and PG Diploma in English Journalism will be the new feathers in the cap of this Faculty.

Sir, the students have ample opportunities for sports and cultural activities on the campus itself. The "Aaghaz" is organized annually by senior students for the benefit of the freshers. Fun games, Quiz Mania, Cultural Extravaganza, Holi celebrations and visits by bollywood celebrities – Akshay Kumar, Tamannah Bhatia, Sunil Shetty, Himesh Rashamiya, Zoya Afroz, Tiger Shroff and Kirti Sanon, were the hallmark events that were arranged for the ventilation of the talents, exposure and entertainment of the students. Further, in order to manage the stress of studies, the University provides counselling services through its faculty members of the Faculty of Behavioural Health Sciences.

Sir, the University is committed to its social responsibilities. To fulfil this obligation, I am to say that we provide state of the art facilities for health care services in our hospital having capacity of 580 beds and that too at affordable charges. For instance, Laparoscopy Surgery is performed for a petty charge of Rs. 1500/- only. The Department of ENT has operated more than 1,000 patients successfully and has organized numerous awareness camps for impaired hearing, head and neck cancer screening and for school health check up. Recently, the University arranged health awareness visit on the campus for over 5000 students from over 45 schools from Delhi NCR and other nearby areas. Free bus service is provided for the patients coming from the nearby 45-50 villages, to say appx. 40 kilometers. Health awareness "Melas" are organized for free health check-ups and on a number of occasions free health care kits / material is distributed. The Department of Pulmonary Medicine is actively engaged in

running DOTS programme for detection of Pulmonary Tuberculosis and is providing free treatment to all cases of Pulmonary Tuberculosis coming to the University Hospital

Sir, I assure you that we will make all efforts to provide quality education to the students and further reiterate to continue our efforts for selfless service to the society, the state and the nation at large, which is our motto also.

Before leaving the podium, I would like to wish all the degree holders a prosperous and eventful bright future and hope them to serve the society with dedication. Dear friends, your selfless service will earn accolades for you,

your parents and the institution which shaped you into a conscientious and compassionate professional.

FACULTY OF MEDICINE & HEALTH SCIENCES



The Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences was set up in 2010 as SGT Medical College, Hospital & Research Institute with the objective to offer medical education and research programmes and provide healthcare services to the needy people in the surrounding areas at affordable cost. Besides MBBS, this Faculty offers M.Sc. (Medical) and Ph.D. programmes in all Pre & Para-clinical subjects. The Internship of the First Batch of MBBS students, admitted in the year 2010, took off from 01st January 2015. M.D. programmes in the clinical subjects are in pipeline.



The Faculty of Medicine & Health Sciences has a 580-bed multi-specialty Hospital attached to it for the hands-on training and skill development of the budding players in medical field. The hospital is very well-equipped with the most advanced facilities in the area and caters to the needs of rural and urban populace in and around Gurgaon. Highly qualified and experienced consultants in all specialities such as General Medicine, General Surgery, Paediatrics, Orthopaedics, Obstetrics & Gynaecology, ENT, Ophthalmology, Respiratory Medicine, Skin & VD, Psychiatry, Radio-diagnosis & Anaesthesiology man the hospital and provide best health services round the clock.

MD Programmes in Pre and Para Clinical Subjects

FACULTY OF DENTAL SCIENCES



The Faculty of Dental Sciences was started as SGT Dental College, Hospital & Research Institute in 2002; and it is now a constituent organ of the SGT University. Besides the Bachelor of Dental Surgery programme, this Faculty offers MDS and Ph.D. courses in all the nine branches of Dental Sciences. Under the tutelage of highly trained, skilled, experienced and productive faculty, the students acquire a solid foundation in various subjects. The Faculty organizes special lectures and scientific presentations by well-known academicians from different parts of the country. An annual exchange programme is organized in collaboration with the University of Detroit-Mercy, Michigan, USA. The students of this faculty have not only topped in university exams, and bagged medals, but also won various Awards and Trophies in inter-college sports and other co-curricular competitions.

The Dental Hospital has an OPD with more than 600 patients every day. There is a state-of-the-art indoor facility in all the nine specialized departments wherein basic and advanced treatments like minor and major surgeries, complex implant surgeries, trauma and cleft lip and cleft palate surgeries are performed daily. Six buses are run to bring patients from 45-50 villages free of cost. Besides providing oral health screening, the hospital distributes oral health care items like toothbrushes, toothpastes and medicines in many neighbouring villages and schools. The 24-hr emergency care is also available. The hospital serves as a platform for experiential learning of the students.

The Public Health Dentistry department organized a 'Workshop on Insight into Questionnaire Designing, Validation and Problem Solving' on 10th March 2014 at the University campus. There were over 175 registrations for the program from over 20 Dental colleges located at Bhopal, Udaipur, Ahmedabad, Chandigarh, Barielly, Jaipur, Lucknow and National Capital Region. Presentations were made by renowned academicians, Dr. Nagesh L and Dr. Ravi V. Shirahatti, who left the audience overawed.



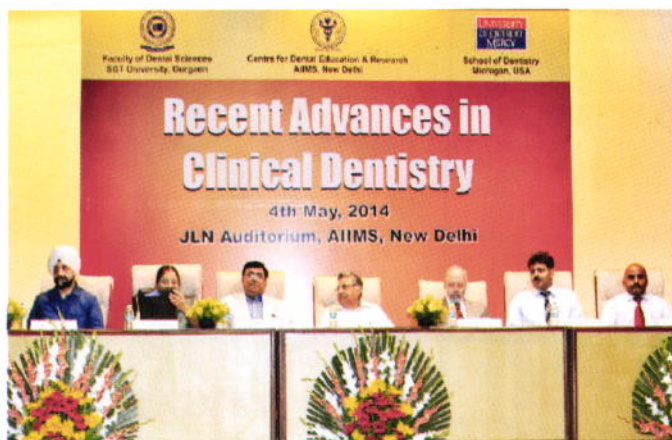
FACE 2014

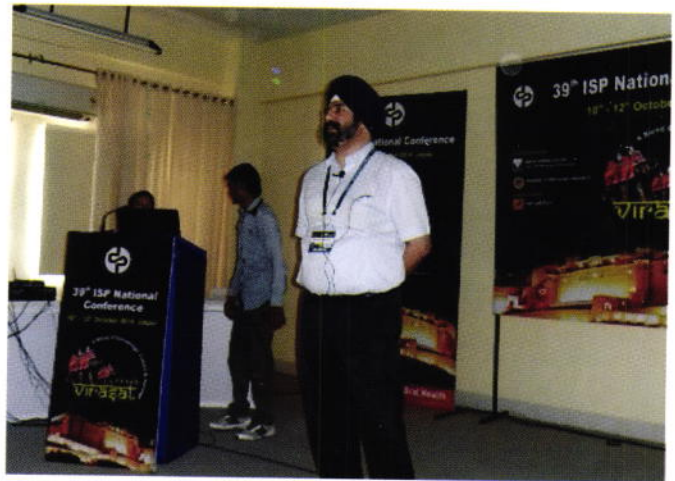


Faculty Accolades

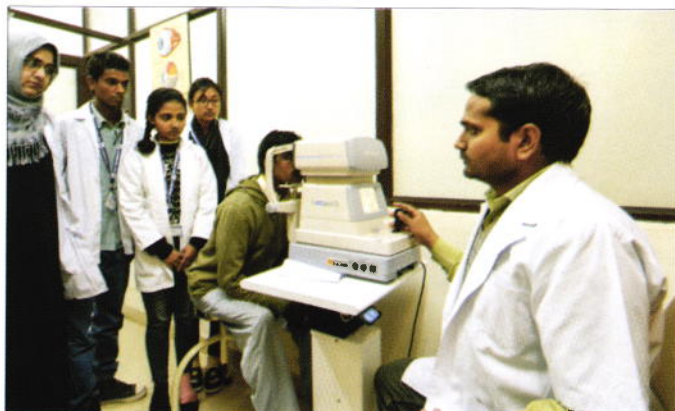

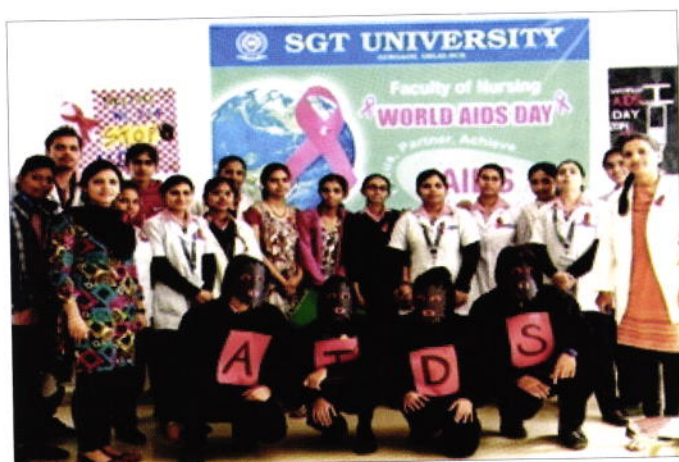

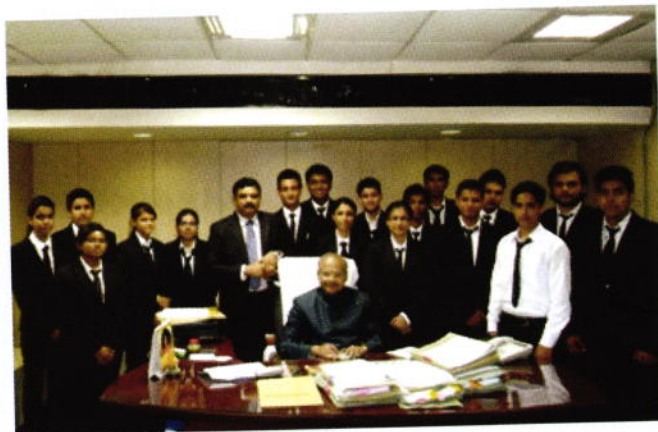


Great Experience for the First year Students of Law August 26, 2014

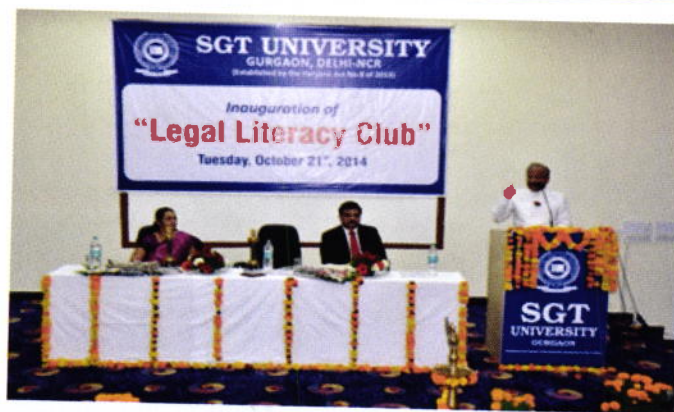
Visit to the Parliament House

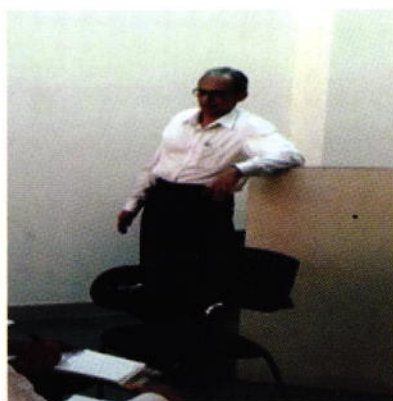

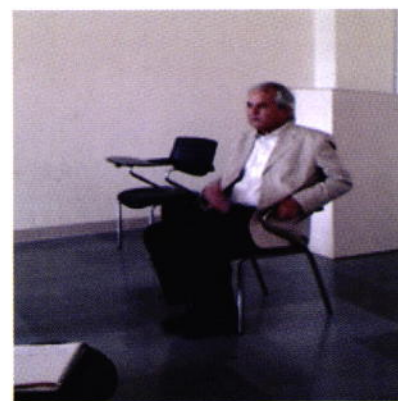
