Sh. Arun Jaitley

Hon'ble Union Minister of Finance,
Corporate Affairs and Information & Broadcasting

Sh. Arun Jaitley was born on December 28, 1952 in New Delhi. His father, Sh. Maharaj Kishen Jaitley, was a prominent lawyer and social activist. Sh. Arun Jaitley studied at St. Xavier's School, New Delhi and graduated in Commerce from Shri Ram College of Commerce, New Delhi in 1973. He obtained his Law degree from University of Delhi in 1977.

He was an Akhil Bhartiya Vidyarthi Parishad (ABVP) student leader in Delhi University Campus and rose to become President of the Students Union of the University in 1974. During Internal Emergency from 1975 to 1977, when civil liberties were suspended, he was under preventive detention for a period of 19 months. He was a prominent leader of the movement against corruption launched in the year 1973 by Sh. Jaiprakash Narayan and was appointed as Convenor of the National Committee for Students and Youth Organisation. He, in association with Satish Jha and Smitu Kothari, founded People's Union for Civil Liberties.

He joined Jan Sangh after release from jail. In 1977, Sh. Jaitley was appointed President of Delhi ABVP and All India Secretary of the same organization. Subsequently, in 1980, he was appointed President of the youth wing of the BJP and Secretary of the Delhi Unit.

Sh. Jaitley actively practised law in the Supreme Court of India and several High Courts in the country from 1977 onward and earned name and fame in the profession. In January 1990, Delhi High Court designated him as a Senior Advocate at the young age of 38, a rare achievement. He was appointed Additional Solicitor General of India by the V.P. Singh Govt. in 1989.

He has several publications on legal and current affairs to his credit. He has the distinction to present a paper on law relating to corruption and crime in India before the Indo-British Legal Forum. He represented country on behalf of the Govt. of India to the United Nations General Assembly Session in June 1998 where the Declaration on Laws Relating to Drugs and Money Laundering was approved.

Sh. Jaitley has been a member of the National Executive of Bharatiya Janata Party ever since 1991. He was Spokesperson of the Party during the period preceding 1999 general elections. He served as Minister of State for Information and Broadcasting (Independent Charge) in the Vajpayee Govt. from 1999 to July 2002. He was also appointed Minister of State for Disinvestment (Independent Charge), a new ministry created for the first time to give effect to the policy of disinvestments under the WTO regime.

He was elevated to the rank of Cabinet Minister in Nov. 2000 and appointed Minister of Law, Justice and Company Affairs and Shipping. He demitted the office of Minister for Shipping with effect from 1st September 2001 and as Union Minister of Law, Justice and Company Affairs on 1st July 2002 to join as General Secretary of the Party and its national Spokesperson for promoting and propagating Party's policies, aims and objects. He worked in this capacity until January 2003 and rejoined the Union Cabinet as Minister of Commerce & Industry and Law & Justice on 29th January 2003.

Sh. Jaitley was elected Leader of Opposition in Rajya Sabha on 3rd June 2009 and consequently, resigned from the post of General Secretary of BJP under Party's One-Man One-Post principle, setting a healthy precedent for others to emulate. In his capacity as Leader of Opposition in Rajya Sabha, he played a vital role during the discussions on the Women Reservation Bill in Rajya Sabha. Apart from Party lines, he extended support to Anna Hazare for the Jan Lokpal Bill in general public interest. He successfully piloted 84th Amendment to the Constitution of India in 2002 freezing parliamentary seats until 2026 and 91st Amendment in 2004 banning defections. Currently, he is Rajya Sabha member from Gujarat.

Recognising his intellectual capabilities and leadership qualities, Prime Minister Narendra Modi inducted him in his cabinet as Cabinet Minister, bestowing on him important portfolios of Finance, Corporate Affairs and Information & Broadcasting. He also served as Minister of Defence from 26th May 2014 to 9th Nov. 2014.

Apart from his above assignments and positions, he is also member of the Board of Governors of Asian Development Bank, Manila, Philippines.

Needless to say, he is an orator par excellence, endowed with the gift of an extempore speaker. He is an epitome of belief in probity in political and personal life. The SGT University is deeply honoured to have him as Chief Guest at its 3rd Convocation to bless the graduates and postgraduates who are entering the next phase of their life.

Vice-Chancellor's Report

On this auspicious eve of the 3rd Convocation, I feel privileged to welcome the Chief Guest, Guest of Honour, distinguished guests and all others present in the Pandal. It is indeed a matter of immense pleasure for all of us to have the esteemed presence of our Hon'ble Minister of Finance, Corporate Affairs and Minister of Information & Broadcasting, Sh. Arun Jaitley ji as Chief Guest on this occasion. The SGT fraternity feels greatly honoured and joins me in sharing the pleasure of having you with us and we express our gratitude for the same. On behalf of all of us, I welcome you, **Sir**, your words of wisdom and blessings to the budding graduates and postgraduates would be a source of inspiration to start their second phase of career as professionals in their respective disciplines.

Sir, prior to establishment of this University, the erstwhile Medical, Dental, Nursing, and Physiotherapy Colleges were affiliated to Pt. B.D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak. Today, we are here to confer degrees upon a mix of students—those who have graduated from Pt. B.D. Sharma University of Health Sciences, Rohtak, University, Rohtak and those who have completed their degrees from SGT University.

Service to mankind by spreading knowledge has been the vision, infatuation and prime motto of Dashmesh Educational Charitable Trust, which was

founded by Sh. Manmohan Singh Chawla in 1999. The convergence of SGT Dental College, SGT Medical College, Dashmesh College of Nursing, SGT College of Physiotherapy, and Institute of Paramedical Sciences by the Haryana Act No. 8 of 2013 culminated into Shree Guru Gobind Singh Tricentenary University in January 2013. The initiative embarked upon a decade and a half ago has widened the scope of “service to mankind” from “dental health care” to a wider horizon, covering more than a dozen branches of knowledge. This marvellous achievement over such a short span of period is owed to hard work, dedication and vision of the Trustees.

Starting with five Faculties in 2013, the University has, now, grown to have thirteen Faculties. Admission to various courses is progressively going upward year after year. During the current academic session, 1168 students were enrolled in various courses raising the total strength to 2773 in 2015-16. We aim to enroll 3000 students during the coming academic session.

Sir, an experienced and talented team of faculty is the backbone of this University. Apart from the development of infrastructure in terms of buildings, labs, library, transport, hospital, etc., we have focussed on strengthening our faculty for capacity building and numbers by adding over 100 teachers

ever since the last Convocation. Likewise, more than 50 competent and experienced officers and junior staff have been inducted at different levels in the non-teaching stream.

The **Faculty of Medicine & Health Sciences** is running MBBS, M.Sc. (Medical) and M.D. courses in 8 pre and para clinical and Ph.D. in 4 subjects. The internship of first batch of MBBS students has concluded on 31st December 2015. We are looking forward to apply for MCI permission to start M.D. courses in clinical subjects in the near future. A good number of academic activities such as conferences, seminars, guest lectures, etc. were organised by the faculty in preceding academic session.

The **Faculty of Dental Sciences** is a well known name in the entire country. In addition to Bachelor degree, this Faculty offers MDS programmes in nine superspecialities and Ph.D. in 4 subjects. The faculty continued its pace with the tradition set by it for organizing the workshops, seminar and conferences.

The **Faculty of Nursing** has been offering Diploma in General Nursing and Midwifery, Post Basic B. Sc. (Nursing), B.Sc. (Nursing) and Master courses in four specializations—M.Sc. (Obstetrical & Gynaecological Nursing), M.Sc. (Psychiatric Mental Health Nursing), M.Sc. (Paediatric Nursing) and M.Sc. (Community Health Nursing). Health awareness campaigns on Diabetes, AIDS & Cancer were undertaken, besides holding Guest lectures on Breast cancer, Palliative care, and scope in military Nursing.

The **Faculty of Physiotherapy** is running one Undergraduate, four Postgraduate and Ph.D. programmes. The Faculty has been conducting regular workshops, seminars and conferences.

The **Faculty of Allied Health Sciences** is offering three Diploma, six UG and two Master degree courses. Three Master courses in MLT, OTT, & OPT will be started from the next year.

The **Faculty of Behavioural Sciences** offers B.Sc. (Clinical Psychology), M.Sc. (Clinical Psychology) and doctoral programmes. A PG course with

specialisation in Counselling Psychology will be introduced from the next academic year. This Faculty provides counselling services to the patients and students to ward off stress of studies and other problems.

The **Faculty of Law** is running four courses, namely, 5-year integrated BA LLB (Hons.) and BBA LLB (Hons.), LLB 3-year and LLM. The Faculty is well known nationally and internationally for its clinical legal education system. Besides the class room teaching, numerous other academic and clinical activities like Moot Court, Visit to Courts, Police Stations, etc. were undertaken during the past one year.

The **Faculty of Commerce and Management** runs B.Com., B.Com (Hons.), BBA (General), BBA (HA), MBA and Ph.D. Programmes in Commerce and Management. The faculty has planned to introduce M.Com. and PG Diploma in Management (e-commerce) from the next academic session.

The **Faculty of Physical Sciences** is running B.Sc. (Non Medical) course since last academic year. However, B.Sc. (Hons.) Maths, M.Sc (Chemistry), M.Sc. (Physics) and M.Sc. (Maths) have been added from 2015-16 session.

The **Faculty of Hotel & Tourism Management** is running a Bachelor course in Hotel Management. MHM and a few Diploma courses will be started from session 2016-17.

The **Faculty of Mass Communication & Media Technology** is running B.A. (Journalism & Mass Communication) course since last year and intend to start PG course from academic session 2016-17.

Sir, I am happy to share that our faculty has made tremendous research contribution. They have 233 research papers to their credit, published in national and international journals and I congratulate them for this achievement.

Some New Faculties and Courses have been added from the current academic year. Establishment of **Faculty of Indian Medical System** has been the cherished dream of this University from its inception

in 2015-16. Presently the faculty is offering BAMS course from the academic session 2015-16 with an intake of 100 students.

Addition of **SGT College of Pharmacy** in 2015 is another feather in University's cap. Admission to the first batches of B. Pharm and D. Pharm were made during the current academic year each with an intake of 60 students.

The academic year 2015-16 also witnessed the foundation of another institution, the **Faculty of Engineering & Technology**. This Faculty offers Bachelor and Master degree courses in four branches—Computer Science & Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, Electronics & Communication Engineering and Civil Engineering — with intake of 60 and 20 in each course, respectively.

The University thanks the Haryana Government and the respective regulatory bodies, viz., Central Council of Indian Medicine and Pharmacy Council of India for permission to start the aforesaid courses

A **Corporate Resource Centre** was set up in 2015 with the aim to groom the students to enable them to be industry-ready by the time they graduate. The Centre arranges students' interaction with industry through industrial visits, short-term projects, summer internships and industry workshops and also organizes on-campus, off-campus and pool-campus placement drives.

The **Internal Quality Assurance Cell** is another notable achievement of the year. It has been created to monitor and promote the standards for providing quality education and research in the University. The Cell has taken several initiatives in this direction.

Sir, the University is always open to **Academic and Examination Reforms**. The University has already adopted semester system and we will be switching over to Choice Based Credit System from the coming academic year. The Examination Branch has earned laurels for successfully and flawlessly conducting examinations and declaring results in record time, despite being in its infancy. Its computerization is in progress.

The University has boarded the **"e-Governance"** train for maintaining transparency in academic and administrative transactions. Hopefully, there will be a paperless "e-governance" system in the University by the coming academic session.

Environmental concern is very close to the University's bosom. Several initiatives have been taken in this direction such as introduction of "Environmental Studies" paper in all UG courses, use of CNG in vehicles, adoption of green concept while planning buildings and making **Swachch Abhiyan** a way of life.

Of late, we have received approval of the UGC under the **Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana** for offering skill development programmes in three areas, namely, Food Production, Tourism & Hospitality Management and Hospital Instrumentation & Management.

As a matter of fact, it has always been our endeavour to remain in the vanguard to improve the infrastructure holistically and introduce innovations so as to transform the University into a Centre of Excellence.

The University has an air-conditioned **Central Library** with collection of over 40,000 volumes of books and journals with the seating capacity of 450. Besides, over 1910 e-journals are subscribed to cater to the academic and research needs of the teachers as well as students. In addition, most of the faculties have their separate libraries with enough number of printed books, e-books and e-journals. Total number of volumes in all the libraries surpasses 1,00,000. The e-journals are accessible all over the campus, including hostels and residences, through Internet. Though library opens 12 hours a day, yet its e-journals and other e-material are accessible 24x7.

The University has ample facilities for indoor and outdoor games and cultural activities. Our sports complex has volleyball, basketball, Lawn Tennis and Badminton Courts, besides having Football Ground and Gym facilities.

Numerous extra-curricular activities like Fun games, festival celebrations, cultural programmes by SGTians,

visits by bollywood celebrities, presentations by folk presentations by artists from various states and musical programs like Qawwalis etc. are organized regularly.

The University is committed to its social responsibilities and to fulfil this obligation, we provide state-of-the-art facilities for health care services in our hospitals and that too at affordable charges. I am proud to share that the dental faculty screened and treated over 15000 patients through 165 free dental care camps. Sir, It is a service which the University is rendering to the community, particularly lower strata of the society, ever since its inception. Free bus service is provided for the patients coming from the 50 nearby villages.

Of late, the University has adopted adjoining Budhera village for its overall development under Govt. of India's **Swa-Prerit Adarsh Gram Yojana (SPAGY)**. **Sir**, through this ambitious project, the University wishes to make Budhera an educated, healthy, socially harmonious, developed and an aware village.

Sir, I assure you that we will make all our efforts to provide quality education to the students and will continue to pursue relentlessly our exalted motto—the selfless service to the society, the state and the nation at large.

Before leaving the podium, I would like to wish all the degree recipients a successful and prosperous future and hope them to serve the society with dedication. Dear friends, your selfless service will earn laurels for you, your parents and the institution which shaped you into conscientious and compassionate professionals.

I again welcome the Chief Guest for being with us to grace the occasion and bless the graduates. Sir, your presence will definitely inspire our students to achieve heights in their career. - University has collaborations with national and international institutes for students exchange programmes.
- Excellent sports infrastructure consisting of playgrounds & courts for football, cricket, volleyball, basketball, badminton, table tennis, gym, etc. provide opportunities to students for their physical development.
- Hostels with accommodation for 1200 residents, separate for boys and girls, have well done-up rooms, wi fi connectivity, RO (UV), and round-the-clock security.

- Teaching and non-teaching staff is provided semi-furnished residential accommodation.

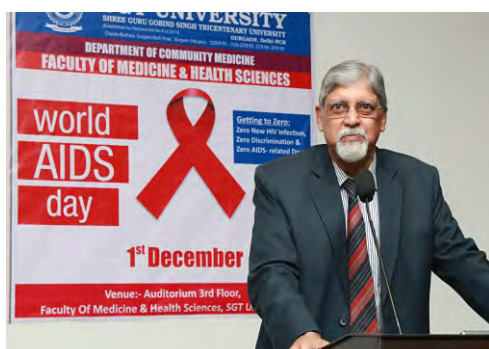


National Conference of Forensic Doctors

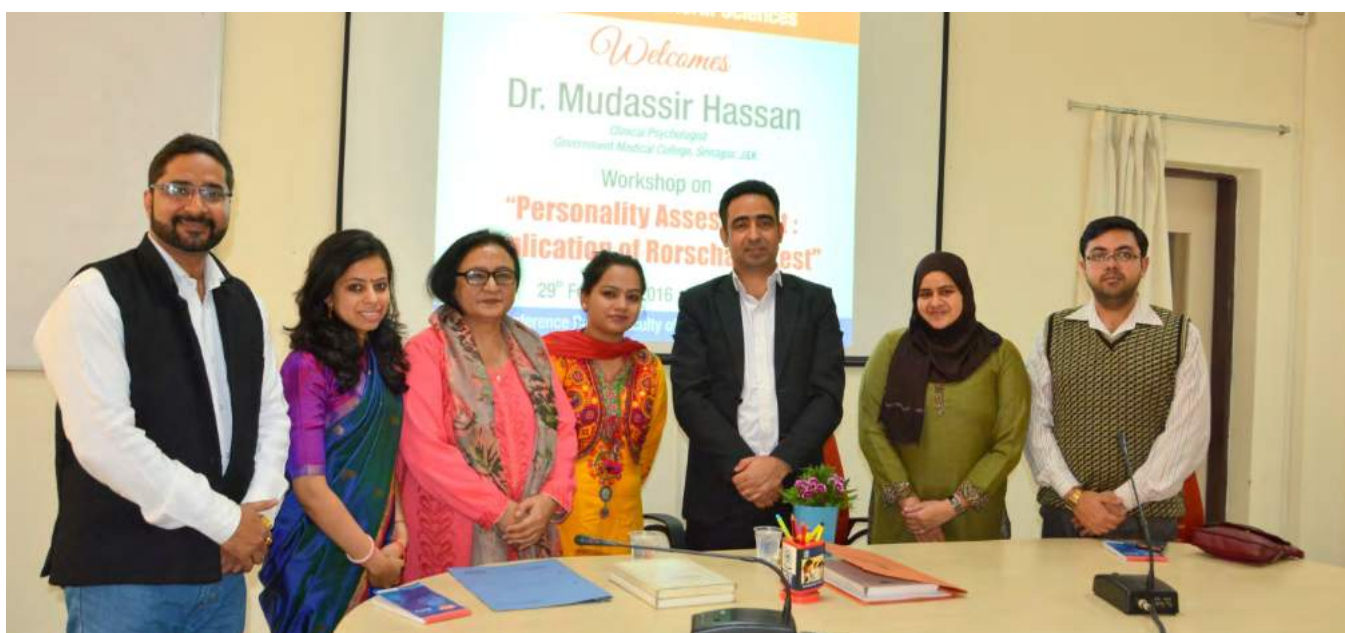

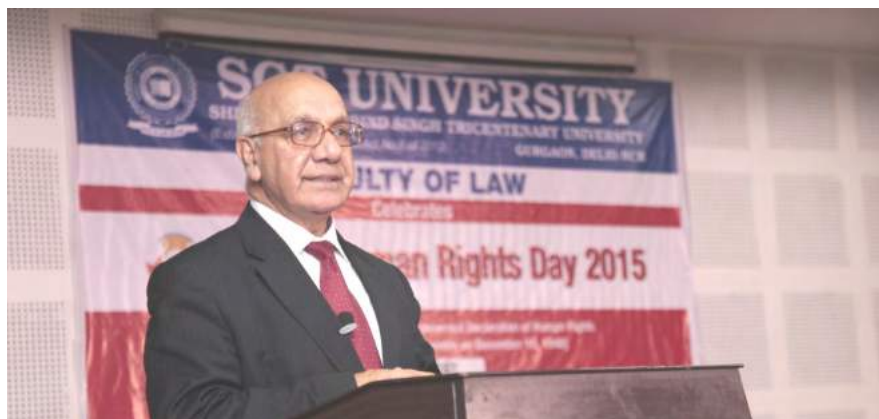
Celebration of Constitution Day on 26th Nov. 2015

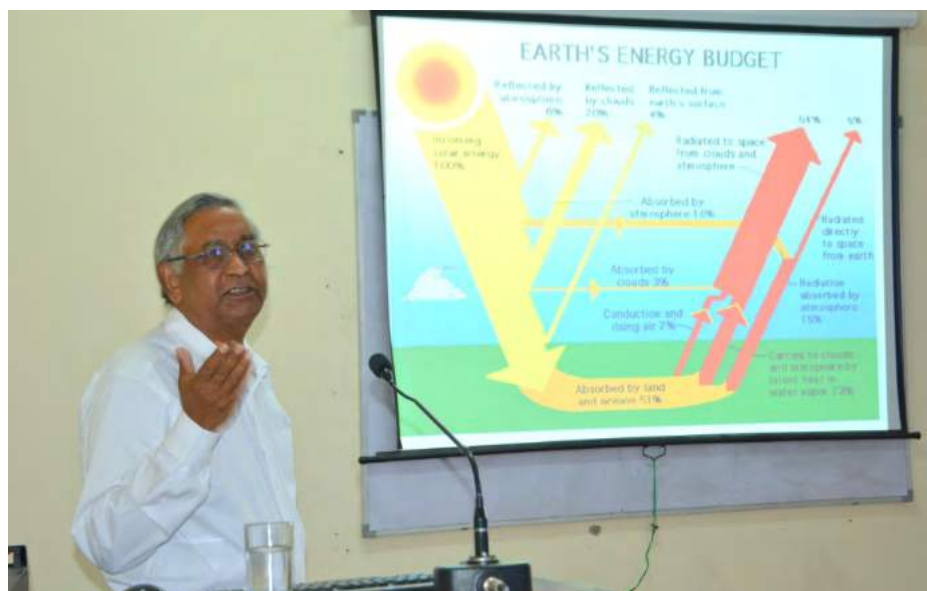

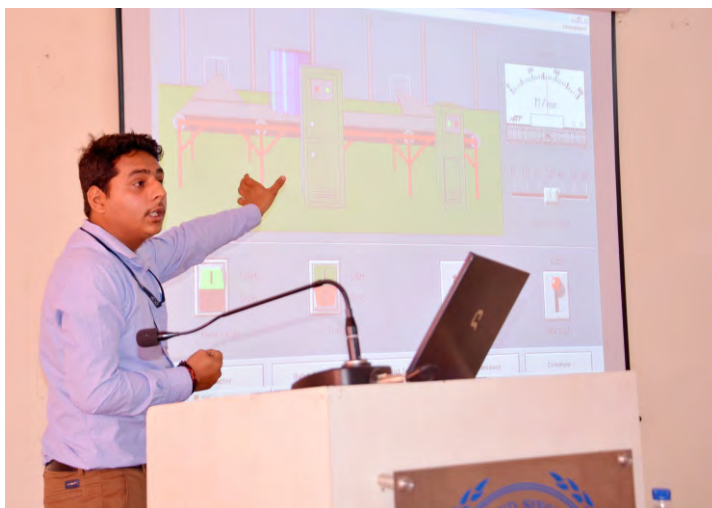

Corporate Resource Centre (CRC)

The CRC was set up in 2015 with the aim to groom the students to enable them to be industry-ready by the time they graduate. It has a strong team of a Director, Placement Managers, full-time soft-skill trainers, language teachers and placement coordinators. For holistic development of the students, lectures and practice classes in communication skills, soft skills and personality development are arranged for students of all streams. Facilities for enhancement of skills in English communication and learning of German and French are also provided. The Centre arranges students' interaction with industry through industrial visits, short-term projects, summer internships and industry workshops and also organizes on-campus, off-campus and pool-campus placement drives. The Centre organized a number of programmes with speakers from Indian and abroad.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell has been created for monitoring and promoting standards for quality education and research in the University. During the last one year, the Cell has taken several initiatives in this direction such as Faculty and Non-Teaching Staff Development Programme; Workshops on Choice Based Credit System, Anti-Ragging Rules and Prevention of Sexual Harassment of Women; Seminar on Awareness of University Statutes and Ordinances; Academic Audit of Departments; and encouragement of faculty to participate in national and international conferences/workshops/seminars/trainings, etc. These initiatives have yielded rich dividends. Over 300 teachers and other staff have participated in these programmes.

Community Welfare

The University is committed to its social responsibilities. To fulfil this obligation, health care services are provided in University hospitals at affordable charges. For instance, Laparoscopy Surgery is performed for a petty charge of Rs. 1500/- only. Free bus service is provided for the patients coming from the nearby villages. Over 15000 patients were screened and treated in 165 free Dental Care Camps where free health check-ups and on a number of occasions, free health care kits / material were distributed. Of late, the University has adopted adjoining Budhera village for its overall development under Govt. of India's Swa-Prerit Adarsh Gram Yojana (SPAGY). The University team, consisting of doctors, engineers, legal professionals and other volunteers, has already started its work in the village. Sir, through this ambitious project, the University wishes to make Budhera an educated, healthy, socially harmonious, developed and an aware village.
